
## Reading.

When reading a range of texts children will:

Develop positive attitudes to reading.

Ask and answer questions about what they read to improve understanding of the text.

Participate in reasoned discussion about a range of texts.



## Writing.

Pupils will be focusing on non-narrative material, using simple organisational devices, such as headings and subheadings to create a non-chronological report on what life was like during World War Two. Pupils will also come across letter writing techniques and also poetry.

Pupils will progressively build varied and rich vocabulary and learn to evaluate and edit their work.

## MFL— French

Pupils will learn how to say hello and introduce themselves, recognise and count numbers 0-6 as well as learning basic colours.

## Understanding physical development, health and well-being.

### **P.E sessions**

Children will be developing their balance and co-ordination along with their team-working and invasion skills through activities such as Gymnastics and Tag-rugby games.

### **PSHE sessions**

Following the 'jigsaw Approach' children will follow the units of 'Being me in my world' and 'Celebrating Difference'.

## Scientific and Computing

In computing, children will use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact.

In science, children construct a simple series electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs, switches and buzzers.

## Historical, Geographical and social understanding.

Pupils will study an aspect or theme in British history that extends their chronological knowledge beyond 1066. They will be looking at the issues which surrounded World War Two and how it effected the lives of the soldiers and those who remained in Britain supporting the war effort.



## Mathematical Understanding

Pupils will aim to cover the following targets, following White Rose programme:

Place Value - Recognise the place value of each digit in a 3-digit number.

Addition and Subtraction - Add and subtract numbers up to 3 digits.

Multiplication and Division - Recall multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

## Understanding the Arts

Children will seek to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials to depict aspects of the World War.
